

AIR ORIENT, KLM AND IMPERIAL AIRWAYS REGULAR SERVICES

Airmail rate period: 1 January 1935 - 3 May 1936

For the sea/air services of all three carriers, i.e. Air Orient, KLM and Imperial Airways, on 1 January 1935, the 1/4oz air letter rates were abolished and the 1/2oz ones were reduced, those to the United Kingdom and Europe becoming 80¢ and \$1.00, respectively


Airmail rate period: 6 May 1935 - 26 March 1936

On 6 May 1935 Imperial Airways reduced its 1/2oz air letter rate to the United Kingdom from 80¢ to 50¢, the postcard rate decreasing from 50¢ to 32¢



ROYAL AIR FORCE GOODWILL FLIGHT, SINGAPORE - JAPAN

February - March 1936

This flight was made by three Short Singapore IIIs of 205 Squadron and led by Air Commodore Sydney Smith. They left Singapore on 10 February 1936, reaching Kuching on the same day, Kudat on the 12th and Manila on the 13th. Two of the aircraft flew to Hong Kong on the 16th, one remaining due to engine trouble. After several delays and failed attempts, the aircraft reached Shanghai on the 26th. A plan to fly to Kagoshima, Japan, on the 29th was abandoned because of a military coup in Japan during which the Premier and Lord Privy Seal were assassinated. The aircraft returned to Hong Kong on 3 March and then left for Singapore, where they arrived on the 9th

IMPERIAL AIRWAYS, PENANG - HONG KONG FEEDER SERVICE

23 March 1936

The flight connecting with the first scheduled flight on the Penang-Hong Kong feeder service left London on 14 March 1936. The first feeder service flight left Penang on the 23rd, arriving in Hong Kong on the 24th. The route taken was: Penang-Udorn-Hanoi-Fort Bayard-Hong Kong. The aircraft used was a DH86 called 'R.M.A. Dorado', G-ACWD

The first scheduled flight on the Hong Kong-Penang feeder service left Hong Kong on 27 March 1936, arriving in Penang on 28 March. The mail arrived in London on 7 April. The aircraft used was the same as for the inward flight

With the opening of the Hong Kong-Penang feeder service mail could be sent to Australia, New Zealand, India, the Middle East, Europe and the United Kingdom by air throughout

December 1936 to Egypt

loz at 90¢ per 1/2oz air letter rate, plus 20¢ registration fee

Initially sent surface from the U.K. to Canada at 11/2d per 1oz, then surface from Canada to Hong Kong at 13¢ for 1oz plus registration fee, and finally by air from Hong Kong to Egypt

Backstamped Vic & Court NO 636, Sandwick NO 636, Victoria NO 636, Hong Kong 7 DE 36, Alexandrie 19 DE 36

With the opening of Imperial Airways' Hong Kong-Penang feeder service use of Air Orient's Saigon-Marseilles route greatly decreased. Air Orient kept some of its rates lower than those of Imperial Airways to attract some custom
